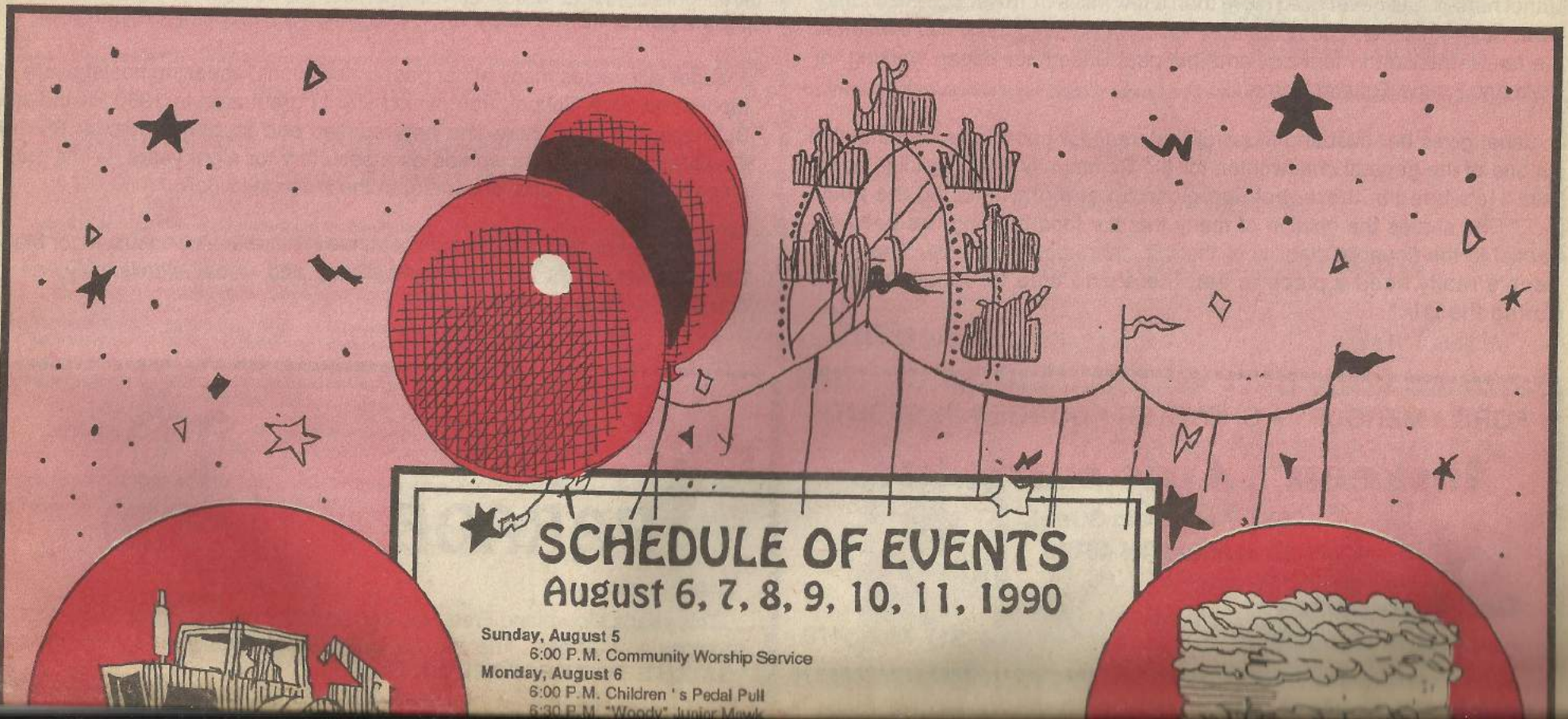

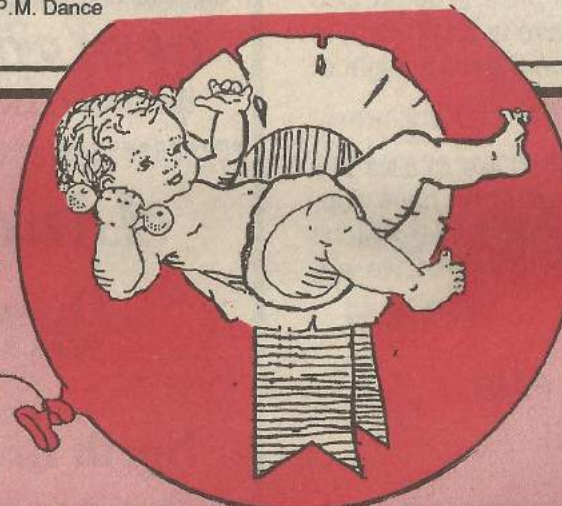

After twenty years of service to the Mooreland Free Fair, Board member and Secretary Janet Modjeski decided this year to take a well-deserved early retirement — "twenty and out."

Mrs. Modjeski came on the Board in 1970 as its secretary, replacing the late Gladys O'Brien. In addition to the usual secretarial duties such as recording, reporting, and corresponding, the Fair Board Secretary is responsible for seeing that the "Fair Paper" gets put together and published each year — no small task.

In her service and loyalty to the Mooreland/Messick community, Janet Brown Modjeski has continued in the tradition of her parents, Norman and Marjorie Brown, and both sets of grandparents, Webb and Cecile Black and Everett and Nellie Brown, all well-known residents of Blue River Township. Janet herself has never lived more than a few miles from her current country home. Since his marriage to Janet in 1966, Michael Modjeski has continued the family tradition in farming, and this past December began working for Main and Frame Funeral Home.

Janet gives her husband much of the credit for her 16-year contribution as one of the general chairwomen for the Community Food Building at the fair: "He's been in there, helping close up at night, missing the pulls. . . ." "And too," she says, "the local people really need a place to eat; there's no time for meals at home during the fair."
